STEWARDSHIP

Becoming Rich

Through the working of the Holy Spirit, Christians understand that riches do not consist of money. In fact, riches have nothing to do with money. We can have very little money and be very rich or be very wealthy and be impoverished. True riches have to do with a right relationship with Jesus Who brings us happiness, satisfaction, joy, love, and peace. Material possessions do not constitute real riches.

Material things are transitory. "When your eyes light on it, [wealth] is gone, for suddenly it sprouts wings, flying like an eagle toward heaven" (Proverbs 23:5). What we possess materially is subject to loss in a variety of ways. Our wealth can be lost in the stock market or through rust, obsolescence, and thievery. No matter how much money we may have, we have no way of guaranteeing that it can be kept safe and secure. Money can be lost, stolen, or its purchasing power lost through inflation. Investments can decline in value and businesses can fail. Our property can be burned or robbed. All material things can be gone quickly. Even if our material things stay with us, we will eventually leave them, because, at the end, we can take nothing with us.

Material goods and earthly treasures are deceitful and uncertain. In Jesus explanation of the Parable of the Sower, He said, *"As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of the world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and it proves unfruitful"* (Matthew 13:22). In the Apostle Paul's letter to Timothy, he wrote, *"As for the rich in this present age, charge them not to be haughty, nor to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, Who richly provides us with everything to enjoy"* (1 Timothy 6:17).

So, if we want to be rich, it cannot be on the basis of material things. Things of this world are much too precarious a foundation on which to build a life. With God's help, we can turn away from material things and turn toward Christ. Jesus urges us to *"lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven…For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also"* (Matthew 6:20-21). As God's people, our riches come from storing up riches in heaven.

Loving God with all of our heart, soul, and strength and our neighbors as ourselves builds up treasures in heaven. As the Holy Spirit leads us to loosen our grip on things of this world, we can learn to be content with what we have rather than always wanting more worldly things.

Through faith, we are rich. As Christians, we receive the riches of eternal life with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.



Communion



We wish to accommodate everyone's preference for Holy Communion. As you know communion is usually served at the altar. However, if you prefer to come to the front of the church to receive communion but have difficulty

navigating the steps, we invite you to come up for the last table. You will be served Holy Communion in front of the steps. Of course, if you feel more comfortable being served Communion in the pew, this will continue to be done.

You now have four options for communion:

- 1. Receive communion at the altar.
- 2. Receive communion in front of the stairs at the last table.
- 3. Receive communion in your pew.
- 4. Use the prefilled communion cups



Remember to bring your loose change for the Mite box donation the first Sunday of each month.


Sheets Needed for Quilters






